

A Primer on Staffing Services

Companies use staffing services for a broad variety of reasons. Using staffing services successfully requires a good understanding of why you are using a staffing service, how it benefits you and establishing realistic expectations with your staffing provider.

Reasons Companies use Staffing Services include:

- Short term needs
- Infrequent hiring lack of comfort with the hiring process
- · Avoiding or minimizing work comp and/or unemployment taxes
- Minimizing benefit expense, i.e. vacation, med/dental
- Undesirable work/High turnover position
- Convenience
- · Rapid growth; inability to keep up with hiring needs
- Ability to assess work habits and performance before extending job offer
- Seasonal business
- Not wanting to advertise an opening
 - o Planned termination
 - o Desire to improve the quality of existing workforce
 - o Small industry
- Hard to fill position
- A staffing plan that includes a core staff of X and temporary workers above X

Staffing Services include:

- · Temporary work: short term or long term
- Evaluation hire
- Direct hire
- · Testing and training

Keys to successfully using staffing service:

- Know why you are using a staffing service
- Provide a thorough job description
 - o Required skills, qualities and/or experience
 - Description of work that will be performed daily
 - Understanding how you will know if the person is performing successfully
- Understanding your responsibility to the temporary worker: providing on-site orientation and supervision
